# THE MEANING AND SIGNIFICANCE OF PALM SUNDAY

At the beginning of the 5<sup>th</sup> week of Lent, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the Church can be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, while other images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil. The custom of veiling crosses and images helps us to concentrate on Christ's work of Redemption. It alerts us to the fact that the whole Church is called to focus now on its immediate preparations for accompanying Jesus on the way of the Cross.

Holy week begins on Palm Sunday, which this year falls on 13<sup>th</sup> April. On this day the Church recalls Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem to accomplish the Paschal Mystery, that is, his Passion, Death and Resurrection. Palm branches are blessed and carried to salute the entrance of our Saviour into the city of our salvation so that one day we may join Christ the King in the eternal Jerusalem. But this King is like no other. He is Jesus our Lord who submits to his Cross so as to take away the sins of the world. Today, *The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew* is proclaimed. This extended narrative vividly recalls the trajectory of events which occur over the course of the week to come. We invite everyone to enter this solemn and joyous time. Please ask others to join us, so that we may journey together to a new dawn in the Easter Garden of Resurrection.
