There will be two ceremonies: the first one begins at 10am with the girls and boys from Scoil Bhride, CBS National, and Ballintotis receiving the sacrament and the second one begins at 1pm with the girls and boys from Gaelscoil Mainistir na Corann, St. John the Baptist National School and Educate Together National School receiving the sacrament. The celebrant will be Bishop Crean. (Please note that on this day there will be no funeral masses)

<u>Holy Communion for the First Time</u>: the first of this year's ceremonies takes place on Saturday, May 4th and it is for the pupils from St. John the Baptist National School and Educate Together National School.

Ballintotis National School, St. Colman's Church, Ballintotis. The ceremony will be on Saturday 18th May.

The Gaelscoil Mass is at 11am because it will be celebrated in Irish and those who are regular 10am Mass-goers may prefer to celebrate in English. There will be a 10am mass on Saturday 25th for that purpose.

(Please note that on these Saturdays, if there is a funeral, it will have to be celebrated in the afternoon and this arrangement is solely because the times of the ceremonies will remain fixed.)

Please remember all the children who are receiving the sacraments in your prayers. Also pray for their families, teachers, friends and all who are involved in preparing them for the celebration of these special days in their faith journey through life.

<u>Feast Days</u>: Monday, 29th April, *St. Catherine of Siena*, 1347-1380, virgin and doctor of the Church, patron of Europe, a humble and dauntless Dominican tertiary, who brought peace to her native Siena, to Italy and to fourteenth-century Europe, spent all her energies on the Church, being able to achieve the pope's return from Avignon to Rome. She is remembered also as a mystic and reformer of religious life. Proclaimed doctor of the Church in 1970 and patron of Europe in 2000.

Wednesday, 1st May, St. Joseph the Worker.

Thursday, 2nd May, St. Athanasius, bishop and doctor of the Church. Born at Alexandria around 295, he fought ceaselessly against heresy, defending the true and equal divinity of Christ. As a result, he had to endure much tribulation and was several times sent into exile.

Friday, 3rd May, Ss. Philip and James, Apostles. St. Philip asks to see and, having seen, he tells the Good News to others. He was born in Bethsaida. Formerly a disciple of St. John the Baptist, he became a follower of Christ. St. James, the son of Alphaeus and a cousin of the Lord, ruled the Church of Jerusalem, wrote an Epistle, and led a life of penance. He converted many of the people of Jerusalem to the faith and was martyred in the year 62.
