Thank you to all who helped in any way in their preparation for receiving the Eucharist for the first time. May the children and their families be strengthened by Jesus, received in Holy Communion, and grow in faith, hope and love.

<u>Dates of the other ceremonies during the month of May</u>: Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup>, CBS National School @ 10am Saturday, May 25<sup>th</sup>, Gaelscoil Mainistir na Corainn, @ 11am Ballintotis National School, St. Colman's Church, Ballintotis. The ceremony will be on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> May.

Please remember all the children who are receiving the sacraments in your prayers. Also pray for their families, teachers, friends and all who are involved in preparing them for the celebration of these special days in their faith journey through life. <u>Feast Days</u>: Monday, May 13<sup>th</sup>, *Our Lady of Fatima*. The apparitions to the three children of Fatima took place in the summer of 1917, beginning on the 13<sup>th</sup> May when the 'Lady' asked them to pray for sinners and an end to the World War. In the final apparition on the 13<sup>th</sup> October, the 'Lady' identified herself as Our Lady of the Rosary and called for prayer and conversion.

Tuesday, May 14<sup>th</sup>, *St. Matthias*, Apostle. Like all the apostles, Matthias was chosen to become' a witness with us of Christ's resurrection'. The story of his election as one of the apostles is given in the first reading. He spent a great deal of time working in Judea; then he travelled east to Cappadocia, where it is said that he was the vital instrument in bringing many pagans to the faith. He was martyred at Colchis on the Black Sea.

Thursday, May 16<sup>th</sup>, *St. Brendan*, was born in 486. He studied at Clonard under St. Finnian. His name is connected with many places in Kerry such as Ardfert and Mount Brandon. He visited Scotland and reached the Hebrides and possibly areas beyond. He founded a monastery in Clonfert in 568 and died there in 578.

This Friday, the 17<sup>th</sup> May, the Rosary will be prayed at the Grotto in Ballinacurra and will be followed by Mass at 8pm. All welcome.

- 2. <u>Pastoral Care</u>: Accord, Bioethics, Emigrants, Family and Marriage, Healthcare, IBDI Drugs Initiative, Immigrants, Prisoners Overseas
- 3. <u>Planning, Communications and Resources</u>: Communications, Finance, Intercom Magazine, Research and Development, Veritas
- 4. <u>Social Issues and International Affairs</u>: Europe, Justice and Peace, Missions, Trocaire
- 5. <u>Worship, Pastoral renewal and Faith Development</u>: Clergy, Permanent Diaconate, Liturgy, Pastoral Renewal and Adult Faith Development, Religious and Vocations

These Commissions and Agencies make a very important and often unseen contribution to helping the Church meet the challenges of our time. Their only source of finance is contributions from individual dioceses. The contribution is population based and so is a major draw on Diocesan resources. Therefore, the Episcopal Conference Collection is aimed at helping to defray at least some of the costs involved.
